ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Is John the Baptist the same person as John the Evangelist? No. Evangelist means "teacher." John the Evangelist is the apostle whom Jesus loved and rested his head on Jesus's bosom at the Last Supper. John the Baptist was deceased about three years at this time.

Father, on the Iconostas and pictures of the Last Supper Judas is included. Is he always included and why? Yes. You must remember an Icon is story in image. Judas is included and you will notice he has no halo, because as the Lord told us he inherits hell. Hell is a very real place and a possibility for all men. One important point to take from this is that Lucifer so hates God that he went after the twelve apostles harder than all other men. The devil was even successful in leading one of the apostles astray, Judas. The important point to take from this is to be careful that you do not allow the devil to lead you astray.

From within, out of the hearts of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness (Mark 7:21-22). Here common sins are listed: but all the rest, both large and small, proceed from the heart, and the form in which they proceed are evil thoughts. The first seed of evil falls as a thought to do this or that. Why and how does this occur? Some of these instances can be explained by known laws of the joining and linking of ideas and images, but only some of them. Another, more significant portion comes from the self-propelled irritation of the passions. When a passion lives in the heart, it cannot help but demand satisfaction. This demand is revealed in an urge for something or another; with the urge is united some object or another. From this comes the thought; "Here is what I need to do." Here the same thing happens as, for example, when one is hungry; feeling hunger, one feels an urge for food; with the urge comes the thought of food itself; from this follows finding something and eating it. The third and, perhaps, largest portion proceeds from the unclean powers. The air is filled with them; they dart around people in packs. Each, according to what kind of demon it is, spreads it's influence around itself to people with whom it comes into contact. Evil flies from them like sparks from a red-hot iron. Where it is readily accepted, a spark is instilled, and with it the thought of an evil deed. Only by this can one explain why evil thoughts arise, for unknown reasons, in the midst of activities which decisively not related to them. But this variety of reasons does not require a variety of ways to react to evil thoughts. There is one law: an evil thought has come----cast it out and the matter is finished. If you do not cast it out the first minute, it will be harder the second minute, and yet harder the third minute; and then you will not even notice how sympathy, desire, and the decision will be born; then the means will appear....and a sinful act is at hand. The first opposition to evil thoughts is sobriety and prayerful vigilance. - St. Theophan the Recluse
