NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST October 8, 2023

TROPAR: When You went down to death, O Life Immortal, You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity. When You raised the dead from the nether world, all the powers of heaven cried out: "O Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory be to You!"! **Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. A Reading from the Second Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (11:31-

12:9): Brethren, The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, who is to be praised forever, knows that I am not lying. In Damascus the governor under King Aretas had the city of the Damascenes guarded in order to arrest me. But I was lowered in a basket from a window in the wall and slipped through his hands. I must go on boasting. Although there is nothing to be gained, I will go on to visions and revelations from the Lord. I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know—God knows. And I know that this man whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows— was caught up to paradise and heard inexpressible things, things that no one is permitted to tell. I will boast about a man like that, but I will not boast about myself, except about my weaknesses. Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say, or because of these surpassingly great revelations. Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

Remembrance Day for the Victims of Holodomor (Stalin imposed Genocide) in Ukraine this year is NOVEMBER 25, 2023.

In 1932–1933, a man-made <u>famine</u>, known as the <u>Holodomor</u>, killed 3.3–5 million people in the <u>Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic</u> (as part of the <u>Soviet Union</u>), included in a total of 5.5–8.7 million killed by the broader <u>Soviet famine of 1930–1933</u>. At least 3.3 million ethnic Ukrainians died as a result of the famine in the USSR. Scholars debate whether there was an intent to starve millions of Ukrainians to death or not.

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father, will we ever use the same Vesper Book (that we used are Saturday) again anytime in the near future? Probably not. In the cycle of prayer in the our Eastern church, there are four important concepts to keep in mind: 1) Easter or Pascha(resurrection of Our Lord) is the Feast which the entire Liturgical Cycle revolves 2) every Sunday is a Little Feast of Resurrection 3) All the major Feasts have special prayers associated with them and 4) there are Eight Resurrectional Tones with each week having a dedicated (singing & prayer)) Tone for the whole week. Naturally, you recognize in the calendar that October 1st does not fall on a Sunday every year. The point being that every seven years the Feast of the Protection will fall on a Sunday. Each year that Sunday will be a different Tone rotating through Eight Tones. Every 56 years, we will have Tone 1 on October 1st on a Sunday. Why does this matter? This matters because in Vespers when you come to the Stichera, which is a type of hymn used in Vespers and Matins, they vary according to the day of the week and of the Feast, such that at Vespers there might be two, four, six, eight or ten Stichera. If Sunday is a Major Feast Day (and it is Great Vespers on Saturday Evening) there are usually ten Stichera, the first four will be for Sunday and the next six will be for the Major Feast Day. When you do the math of all the possible combinations, eight tones and seven days, you end up with 56 combinations of all these prayers, it might be 56 years before the exact order of the prayers in the pamphlet will reoccur.

Because Vespers has fallen into disuse in our church, the typical parishioner is unfamiliar with those parts of Vespers that don't change and those parts that do based on the day and the Feast. To make Vespers easy for this major Holy Day your priest compiled this little prayer booklet so that all you had to do is follow the booklet, without flipping pages. When such a time comes that the parishioners are familiar for Vespers, we can use a Vespers book that is separate from the movable prayers for the Feast Day which will require flipping back and forth between the Vespers Book and the Special Prayers.

To pray is to descend with the mind into the heart, and there to stand before the face of the Lord, ever-present, all seeing, within you.

If you examine your life well, you will find many instances when God showed His unmistakable mercy to you. Trouble was brewing, but it passed you by for some reason. God delivered you. Acknowledge these and thank God, Who loves you.

Remember that each of us has his own cross. The Golgotha of this cross is in our heart. It is being lifted or implanted through a zealous determination to live according to the Spirit of God. Just as salvation of the world is by the Cross of God, so our salvation is by our crucifixion on our own cross.
