Remembrance Day for the Victims of Holodomor (Stalin imposed Genocide) in Ukraine this year is NOVEMBER 25, 2023.

In 1932–1933, a man-made <u>famine</u>, known as the <u>Holodomor</u>, killed 3.3–6 million people in the <u>Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic</u> (as part of the <u>Soviet Union</u>), included in a total of 5.5–8.7 million killed by the broader <u>Soviet famine of 1930–1933</u>. At least 3.3 million ethnic Ukrainians died as a result of the famine in the USSR. Some Scholars debate whether there was an intent to starve millions of Ukrainians to death or not.

Having imparted the parable about the man who became rich and planned to just eat, drink, and be merry, and for this was struck with death, not remaining alive for his supposed pleasures, the Lord concluded; "So is he that lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God." Luke 12:21. "So"—that is, such occurs to, or such a lot befalls, those who commit both the one and the other. Those who become rich and forget about God think only about the pleasures of the flesh. Let those who desire to avoid this bitter lot not lay up treasure for [themselves] but be rich only toward God. Since riches come from God then devote them to God when they flow, and holy riches will come of this. Share all surplus with the needy—this will be the same as returning to God what was given by God. He who gives to a poor person gives to God. Seemingly exhausting his riches, such a person becomes truly rich—rich in good works. He becomes rich for the sake of God, in pleasing Him. He becomes rich in God, attracting His Goodwill. He becomes rich from God, Who makes one who is faithful over a few things, ruler over many things. He becomes rich toward God and not toward himself, for he does not consider himself to the owner, but only a stewart and an accountant, whose entire concern consists in satisfying all who come to him in need. But he fears spending anything special on himself, considering it to be an improper use of the property entrusted to him. - St. Theophan the Recluse

On the Feast of the Entrance of the Theotokos into the temple, "Christ is Born" begins to be sung, preparing the believers for a worthy meeting of the Feast of Christ's Nativity. Having understood this inspiration, act according to it. Delve deeply into the mystery of the Incarnation of the Only Begotten Son of God; ascend to it's beginning in the pre-eternal counsel of God. Concerning the existence of the world and man within it; see it's reflection in the creation of man; joyfully meet the first tidings of it immediately after the fall; rationally trace it's gradual revelation in Old Testament prophecies and pre-figurations. Understand who prepared to receive God incarnate and how they prepared, under the influence of divine institutions and activities within Israel. Pass, if you wish, beyond the borders of God's people and gather there rays of God's light, shining in the darkness, and ponder to what degree those chosen from among all nations reached the presentiment of the extraordinary manifestation of God's providence for man. This will be a mental preparation period but now is the time of the [Nativity] Fast.—Prepare yourself, go to Confession, and receive Communion of Christ's Holy Mysteries; this will be an active and living preparation if, as a result of all this, the Lord grants you to sense the power of His coming in the Flesh—then, when the Feast comes, you will celebrate it not out of joy foreign to you, but out of an intimate joy. -St. Theophan the Recluse
