PASCHAL TROPARION: Christ is risen from the dead, trampling death by death, and to those in the tombs giving life.

TROPAR: When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection and cast off the ancestral condemnation, they proudly told the apostles: "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen, granting to the world great mercy."

TROPAR: At the mid-point of the Feast, O Savior, water my thirsty soul with the streams of true godliness; for You cried out to all: Let any who thirst, come to Me and drink. O Source of life, Christ our God, glory to You!

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

KONDAK: Drawn to the well by faith, the Samaritan woman beheld You, the Water of wisdom, and drinking abundantly of You, she inherited the heavenly Kingdom for ever, becoming everlastingly glorious.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles, 11:19-26, 29-30:

Brethren, in those days, the apostles scattered because of the troubles caused by what happened to Stephen, and went as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, making the message known to none but Jews. Some of them were Cyprots and Cyreneans who had come to Antioch and began to talk even to the Greeks, announcing the good news of the Lord Jesus to them. The hand of the Lord was with them and a great number of them believed and were converted to the Lord. News of this eventually reached the ears of the church in Jerusalem, Barnabas' being sent to Antioch. On his arrival he rejoiced to see the evidence of God's favor. He went off to Tarsus to look for Saul; once he had found him, he brought him back to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and instructed great numbers. It was in Antioch that the disciples were called Christians for the first time. This made the disciples determine to set something aside, each according to his means, and send it to the relief of the brothers who lived in Judea. They did this, dispatching it to the presbyters in the care of Barnabas and Saul.

Gospel of John 4:5-42



At that Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sichar, near the field that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, wearied as he was from the journey, was sitting at the well. It was about the sixth hour. There came a Samaritan woman to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me to drink"; for his disciples had gone

away into the town to have food. The Samaritan woman therefore said to him, "How is it that you, although you are a Jew do ask a drink of me, who am a Samaritan woman?" For Jews do not associate with Samaritans. Jesus answered and said to her. "If you did know the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give me to drink,' you perhaps would have asked of him, and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then have you living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, and his sons and his flocks?" In answer Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again. He, however, who drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him shall become in him a fountain of water springing up unto life everlasting." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water that I may not thirst, or come here to draw." Jesus said ot her, "Go, call your husband and come here." The woman answered and said, "I have no husband," Jesus said to her, "You have said well 'I have no husband,' for you have had five husbands, and he whom you now have is not your husband. In this you have spoken truly." The woman said to him, "Sir, I see that you are a prophet. Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, but you say that at Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship." Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth. For the Father also seeks such to worship him. God is spirit, and they who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth." The woman said to him "I know that the Messiah is coming (who is called Christ), and when he comes he will tell us all things." Jesus said to her, "I who speak with you am he." And at this point his disciples came; and they wondered that he was speaking with a woman. Yet no one said, "What do you seek?" or "Why do you speak with her?" The woman therefore left her water-jar and went away into the town, and said to the people "Come and see a man who has told me all that I have ever done. Can he be the Christ?" They went forth from the town and came to meet him. Meanwhile his disciples besought him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." But he said to them, "I have food to eat of which you do not know." The disciples therefore said to one another "Has someone brought him something to eat?" Jesus said to them "My food is to do the will of him who sent me to accomplish his work. Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, and then comes the harvest' Well I say to you, lift up your eyes and behold that the fields are already white for the harvest. And he who reaps receives a wage, and gathers fruit unto life everlasting, so that the sower and the reaper may rejoice together. For herein is the proverb true 'One sows, another reaps.' I have sent you to reap that on which you have not labored. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labors." Now many of the Samaritans of that town believed in him because of the word of the woman who bore witness, "He told me all that I have ever done." When therefore, the Samaritans had come to him, they besought him to stay there; and he stayed two days. And far more believed because of his word. And they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of what you have said, for we have heard for ourselves and we know that this in truth the Savior of the world."

Acts 12:12-17; John 8:42-51

What means, do you think, did the Lord use to explain to the Jews the reason for their not believing in Him? The means He used was to tell them the truth. And because I tell you the truth, you believe Me not. (john 8:45) The lie, as it is said, turned into their flesh and blood, and made them incapable of receiving the truth. Why do people not believe today? For the same reason—the Lord speaks the truth, and therefore they do not believe. But how can this be? Are they not all learned and do they not talk only about the truth? They have many words, but no works. The weaving of their schemes is like the spinning of a spiders web, but they do not notice the flimsiness of it. The principles of their systems are groundless, and their conclusions cannot be proved, but they are satisfied with them nevertheleass. There is now such a demand for hypotheses that it seems that they alone make up the entire content of their minds, and this reputed to be solid education. They apply the fog of their dreams to the few facts they have procured and in this fog these facts appear in a totally different way than what they are in reality. Nevertheless, this all reputed to be the sphere of immutable truth. So their mind has gone rotten, and it's taste has been ruined! How can it contain the truth! And so they do not believe the Lord, Who speaks only the Truth.- St. Theophan the Recluse

Acts 12:25-13:12; John 8:51-59

The Jews became angry with the Lord because of His accusation, and picked up stones to cast at Him. *But the Lord went through the midst of them, and so passed by.
