1Corinthians 15:1-11; Matthew 19:16-26

A rich man shall hardly ever enter into the Kingdom of Heaven (Matthew 19:23). Here is meant a rich man who sees within himself the many means and powers that lead to his prosperity. But as soon as one who has many possessions cuts off all attachments to them, extinguishes within himself all reliance on them, and ceases to see them as his substantial support, then in his heart he is the same as one who possesses nothing. To such a one is the road to the Kingdom opened. Riches then not only do not hinder him, but they help him, for they provide a means for charitable works. Riches are not the danger, but rather reliance upon them and attachment to them. This thought can be generalized in this way: whoever relies on something and is attached to it is rich in that thing. Whoever relies on God alone and cleaves to Him with all his heart is rich in God. Whoever relies on something turns his heart to it instead of to God. Such a person is rich in this other thing, but not in God. Here are meant such things as family, connections, intelligence, rank, spheres of activities and so forth. From this it follows that he who is not rich in God has no entrance into the Kingdom of God. - St. Theophan the Recluse

DORMITION FAST: The traditional rule for the Dormition Fast is a strict abstinence from August 1 to 14, with the usual mitigations (wine and oil) for Saturday and Sunday and the Feast of the Transfiguration (August 6). It is, therefore, observed as the Great Fast. The observance of this fast is voluntary.

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? What is the Dormition Fast and when did it start? Just like the Feast of Resurrection (Easter), there is a preparation period which lasts 40 days (The Great Fast). The preparation period for the Feast of the Dormition of Holy Mother of God is a two week preparation/penitential period, which begins August 1 of each year. As the Great Fast ends with the Dormition of Christ on the Cross (Good Friday), we prepare for our Blessed Lady's Dormition and her resurrection and ours, even though we don't experience it yet in time. This preparation period is not only for her feast, but also to prepare us for our Dormition and resurrection and to lead us to heaven. BUT Father, can you explain this in English? The Dormition of the Mother of God is the day that she died. The Blessed Mother was put in a tomb. Thomas-aka Doubting Thomas, the Apostle, was not present at her death and burial, he asked to see where she was laid and when they arrived at the tomb was empty and filled with the aroma of roses. Roman Catholics call this day the Assumption of the Mother of God because her body was taken to heaven. HOW DO WE KEEP THIS FAST PERIOD? The traditional fast is a period of 14 days no meat and dairy. The fast is voluntary. Just like Lent we can omit meat perhaps on Wednesdays and Fridays, if we choose.

St Isaac the Syrian says we should:

- Pray with attention so that we can have a true encounter with God
- Pray with humility because this sort of prayer goes straight to God's ear
- Pray with affection and tears with joy and thanksgiving, but also with true repentance and purity.
- Pray with patience and ardor 'to deny oneself' is courageously to persevere in prayer.
- Pray from the depths of the heart even if we pray
 using 'the words of another' they should be uttered as if
 they are our own. St. Isaac says this is especially true of the Psalms.
- Pray with faith and absolute trust in God because He knows our life
