

A Reading from the First Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (3:9-17):

Brethren, we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building. By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as a wise builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay or straw, their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss but yet will be saved—even though only as one escaping through the flames. Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for God's temple is sacred, and you together are that temple.

At that time Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and cross the sea ahead of him, while he dismissed the crowd. And when he had dismissed the crowd, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. And when it was late, he was there alone, but the boat was in the midst of the sea, buffeted by the wave, for the wind was against them. But in the fourth watch of the night, he came to them, walking upon the sea, they were greatly alarmed, and exclaimed, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear. Then Jesus immediately spoke to them, saying, "Take courage; it is I, do not be afraid." But Peter answered him and said, "Lord, if it is you, bid me come to you over the water." And he said, "Come." Then Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water to come to Jesus. But when he saw the strong wind, he was afraid; and as he began to sink and he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!" And Jesus at once stretch forth his hand and took hold

of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind fell. But they who were in the boat came and worshipped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." And crossing over, they came to the land of Gennesaret.

About the guidance of grace and about tears

O good Lover of man, Who accepted the two farthings and praised the good will of the widow, accept the prayers of Thy servant; multiply my prayer and grant my requests, that I might become a temple for Thy grace. May it abide in me and itself teach me how to please it. May it strum my heartstrings and play songs of contrition filled with gladness. May it fasten my mind as with a bridle, that I might not sin before Thee by going astray, and might not be cast out of the light.

Hearken, O Lord, hearken unto my prayer, and grant that I who am unclean might become pure, that I who am senseless might become wise, that I who am useless might become profitable in the flock of Thy chosen laborers and of all the saints who have been pleasing to Thee, and that I might be admitted to Thy kingdom.

The glad in paradise intercede for me and cry out to Thee, O only Lover of mankind. Attend Thou to their prayers. Through them will I give Thee glory in return, for Thou hast hearkened unto their prayers and hast been generous to me and not disregarded my prayers.

Thou, O Lord, hast said by Thy Prophet: open thy lips, and I will fill them. Behold, both the heart and the lips of Thy servant are opened; fill them with Thy grace, that I may bless Thee unceasingly, O Christ my God and Savior.

My prayer is powerless, but mine iniquities are great and mighty. Sins overwhelm me and my weaknesses dismay me; Thou art wealthy and good, kindhearted and merciful.

When the sound of the trumpet blares out, the nations shutter and every man is to receive reckoning according to his labors, then, O Lord, be my helper, for to You do I run. Accept our service O Lord, hope of those of those above and hope of those below, and have mercy on us. Be merciful to us, O Lord, be merciful to our parents; be merciful to our teachers, be merciful to our brothers. Be merciful to us, O Lord, and give rest to our relatives who have reposed and to all who have died and did confess You, believe in You and taste Your Life-Creating Blood. Vouchsafe us together with Your sheep to enter into Your pasture, and together with Your saints to offer You praise in accordance with Your greatness unto the age of ages.

PRAYER FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE CHURCH

O glorious St. Michael, guardian and defender of the Church of Jesus Christ, come to the assistance of the Church, against which the powers of hell are unchained, guard with especial care her august Head, and obtain that for Him and for us the hour of triumph may speedily arrive.

O glorious Archangel St. Michael, watch over us during life, defend us against the assaults of the devil, assist us especially at the hour of death; obtain for us a favorable judgement, and the happiness of beholding God face to face for endless ages. Amen.



ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Why do we bless flowers for the Feast of the Dormition of Our Blessed Lady? The historic origin of the custom seems to have been from the blessing of first fruits of olives by the Patriarch of Constantinople. The Slavic Church titles this a "Blessing of Herbs," and the intention of the prayers seems to be the blessing of herbs (and spices) that were used for medicinal purposes in the summer heat which conducive to

many infectious diseases, which is apparent from the reading of the prayers. In more recent times, the tradition concerning the death of the Theotokos, that flowers were discovered in her empty tomb after her body was taken into heaven, has influenced this office and it has largely become a blessing of flowers. [see above]

Blessing of Flowers

Following the Ambon Prayer of the Liturgy, the flowers may be blessed.



The historical origin of this custom seems to have been the blessing of the first fruits of olives by the Patriarch of Constantinople. DeMeester (Benedizianale Bizantino, p. 504.) notes that in its present form it has many borrowings from the Roman tradition. The Slav texts title it a "Blessing of Herbs," and the intention of the prayer seems to be the blessing of herbs that were used for

medicinal purposes in the summer heat which was conducive to many infectious diseases. In more recent times, the tradition concerning the death of the Theotokos that flowers were discovered in her tomb after her body was taken into heaven has influenced this office and made it a blessing of flowers. Recommendation of the Inter-eparchial Liturgy Commission: the flowers are incensed as the Troparion (Kondak optional) is sung, then the prayer for the blessing of plants ("O Almighty, Eternal God, by your word alone..."(Hamtramck Euchologion, p. 301); then the following prayer (proposal of the Intereparchial Liturgy Commission, October 2018): "O God, you commanded the sons of Israel through Moses your servant, that they bring forth the newly-picked fruits to the priest, and bringing the fruits of choices trees, they rejoiced before you, their God. Come, O merciful One, to our assembly and pour out your abundant overflowing blessing on us and on the freshly-picked seed, berries, plants, and fruits which we offer you in thanksgiving. On this feast, grant by your blessing that they bring help to people, animals, and beasts, against illnesses, plagues, wounds, evil works, and other harm, as well as against demonic tricks and slander, wherever they will be placed or brought. Together with the good works of our hands, through the prayers of the Theotokos, whose Dormition feast we gloriously celebrate today, may we be welcomed where she has been assumed. Through the mercies, kindness, and love of your only begotten Son, with whom you are blessed, together with your all holy, good and life-creating Spirit, now and ever and forever." Response, "Amen." The plants are then blessed with the sprinkling of the Jordan Water. The various traditions concerning the death and assumption of Mary are found in two apocryphal works: the "Assumption of Mary" (Transitus Mariae) written at the beginning of the fifth century and the "Dormition of Mary," written by John of Thessalonica (d. about 630 A. D.).
