PROTECTION OF MOTHER OF GOD (October 1)- The Protection of the Mother of God is one of the most beloved <u>feast</u> days on the <u>Ukrainian</u> <u>Catholic calendar</u>, commemorated on <u>October 1</u>st among all the Slavic peoples. The feast is celebrated on <u>October 28</u>th in the Greek tradition. It is also known as the feast of the **Virgin Mary's Cerement**. In most Slavic

languages the word "cerement" has a dual meaning of "veil" and "protection." The Russian/Ukrainian word *Pokrov* (Ποκροβ), like the Greek *Skepi* (Σκέπη), has a complex meaning. First of all, it refers to a cloak or shroud, but it also means protection or intercession. For this reason, the name of the feast is variously translated as the **Veil of Our Lady**, the **Protecting Veil of the Theotokos**, the **Protection of the Theotokos**, or the **Intercession of the Theotokos**. The Protection is commemorated most fervently in Slavic churches, probably because St. Andrei was a Slav. The first celebration of the Theotokos' cerement in the <u>Ukrainian Catholic Church calendar</u> dates back from the 12th century and today is celebrated throughout the Ukrainian <u>Orthodox and Catholic Church</u>. The feast day commemorating the <u>miracle</u> is celebrated with an <u>All-Night Vigil</u>, with many of the same elements as occur on <u>Great Feasts</u> of the Theotokos. However, this feast has no post feast.

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father, what is the Lucan Jump?

The continuous reading of the Gospel of the Holy Evangelist Luke begins on the Monday following the Sunday after the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The four Gospels are all read in their entirety in the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church Year and

the reading of each begins with a great Feast. The Gospel of Saint John the Theologian begins with the Feast of Feasts, the Pascha of our Lord and is read until Pentecost. The Gospel of St. Matthew begins with the Feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit, and is read until the Feast of the Holy Cross. The first Sundays in the Matthew cycle and in the Lucan cycle are of the call of the apostles Peter and Andrew, James and John, indicating that these Gospels also call us to follow after Jesus our Lord. The Gospel of St. Mark is read during the Holy and Great Fast, but since the Divine Liturgy is celebrated only Saturday and Sunday, the remaining sections are read in the last six weeks of the Matthean and Lucan cycles. This is why, no matter where we are in the cycle of Sundays after Pentecost, we begin the course reading the Gospel of St. Luke on Monday that comes before the second Sunday after the Exaltation of the Cross. This year it is September 22. The Greek Church, however, begins to number the Sundays by "Weeks after the Holy Cross." Of course, a historical factor in this was that September 23, (the Birthday of Augustus, very important when the imperial ideals were still living), was the beginning of the New Year, so that reading of a new Gospel seemed appropriate at this time. Later, the New Year was moved to September 1.
