TROPAR: By Your cross You destroyed death; You opened Paradise to the thief; You changed the lamentation of the myrrh-bearers to joy, and charged the apostles to proclaim that You are risen, O Christ our God, offering great mercy to the world.

TROPAR: Today is the prelude of the good pleasure of God, and the proclamation of salvation for mankind. In the Temple of God the Virgin is clearly revealed, and beforehand announces Christ to all men. To her, then, let us cry aloud with a mighty voice: Rejoice, fulfilment of the Creator's plan.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Now and forever and ever. Amen.

KONDAK: The Savior's pure temple, the precious bridal chamber and Virgin, the sacred treasury of the glory of God, is brought today into the house of the Lord; and with her she brings the grace of the divine Spirit. God's angels sing in praise of her: She is indeed the heavenly dwelling-place.

PROKEIMENON: Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You. Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous. My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Savior. (no repeat)

A Reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians (2:14-22):



Brethren, for Christ is our peace; in his flesh he has made both Jew and Greek into one, and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances in decrees, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross,

thus putting to death that hostility through him. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.



ALLELUIA: Alleluia (3). Come, let us rejoice in the Lord; let us acclaim God our Savior. Alleluia (3). Let us come before His countenance with praise and acclaim Him with Psalms. Alleluia (3). Here, O daughter and see, and incline your ear. Alleluia (3). The rich among the people shall

entreat your countenance. Alleluia (3).

Luke 12: 16-21



The Lord told this parable: "The land of a certain rich man brought forth abundant crops. And he began to take thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, for I have no room to store my crops?' And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store up all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have many good things laid up for many

years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry [happy].' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night do they demand your soul of you; and the things that you have provided, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich as regards God." After He had said this, He cried out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

INSTEAD OF "IT IS TRULY RIGHT": Seeing the entrance of the pure one, angels marvel in wonder how the Virgin could enter the holy of holies. Let no hand of the profane touch God's living ark, but instead let the lips of those who are believers sing out ceaselessly in the words of the angel, crying out with great joy to the Mother of God: O pure Virgin, you are truly higher than all.

COMMUNION HYMN: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest. I will take the chalice of salvation and I will call upon the name of the Lord. Alleluia, alleluia.




ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Could you give a reflection for Phillip's Fast? All of us, indeed the whole world, should recognize the Kingship of Jesus Christ and submit to him. Only then could there be One Church and One World. Without Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who is God, no peace is possible. So, we have difficulties in our lives because of a wonderful gift God gave us; notably, free will. Free will is to allow us to

be free to choose the good. To choose to sin will lead you to eternal suffering, hell. Jesus, as a baby in the manger, knew that this was the beginning of the path that ends on the Cross. The Nativity of Jesus Christ is the beginning of the Story of Salvation, as recognized by mankind, and the Cross is the culmination of the Story of Salvation for mankind. This is why the Processional Cross of The Church is composed of the Star of Bethlehem and the Cross, i.e. Crucifix (notice the processional cross between the fans behind the altar). This is a reminder to us of how God entered the world and how God exited the world, saving us from our sins. When we freely choose to follow God, Jesus Christ the Son of God, then we are able to be saved from our sins. We can avoid Eternal Damnation. It is only through Jesus' sacrifice of Himself on the cross, the perfect blood sacrifice to atone for sin, that our sins could be forgiven for He is the Eternal Lamb of Goc. Think about it this way, if I wish to obtain something from you, that you consider your greatest possession, what do I have to give to you to obtain this? Would you accept something from me of lesser value for this? No, the typical person wants something of greater value than what they are giving up. So, what can I offer for my sins, by which I deserve hell? In short there is nothing I can give to God to atone for my sins, to trade with God, for heaven; because heaven is greater than anything I have, even my own life. The only way to "trade up" is for God to choose to give me Himself to atone for my sins because only God is this "perfect" or "greater value" gift. Hence, God is so incredibly loving (agape - sacrificial giving love) that He offers Himself to atone for my sins. This is the "Gift of Christmas." This gift is freely given and we are free to choose this gift. We demonstrate our choosing by living a holy life, to the best of our abilities.

Christ and the Law

When Christ says to him, "if you would enter life, keep the commandments," the man expects him to add immediately, "My commandments." "Which ones?" he asks. He was quite deceived in his expectation. For Christ did not answer him as he expected, but simply pointed him to the law.

This is not because the law is perfection, for "no one is justified by the law," as it is written, but because the life lived according to the law is a kind of introduction to the eternal life, briefly acquainting trainees to the things above. "For the law was put in charge to lead us to Christ."

The law is the starting point for social justice. Christ is the perfection. For the beginning of good is to act justly, He says. Just action then is shown by the law, but goodness is shown by Christ. The law taught us to repay those who wish to harm us, as in "eye for eye, tooth for tooth."

But Christ taught us to let go such balanced vengeance, with the view to the greater good, teaching that "if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also; and if anyone would sue you and take your coat, let him have your cloak as well."
