**TROPAR:** When You went down to death, O Life Immortal, You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity. When You raised the dead from the nether world, all the powers of heaven cried out: "O Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory be to You!"

***A reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Colossians (3:4-11):***



Brethren, when Christ our life appears, then you shall appear with him in glory. Put to death whatever in your nature is rooted in earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desires, and that lust which is idolatry. These are the sins, which provoke God's wrath. Your own conduct was once of this sort, when these sins were your very life. You must put that aside now; all the anger and quick temper, the malice, the insults, the foul language. Stop lying to one another. What you have done is put aside your old self with its past deeds and put on a new man, one who grows in knowledge as he is formed anew in the image of his Creator. There is no Greek or Jew here, circumcised or uncircumcised, foreigner, Scythian, slave or freeman. Rather, Christ is everything in all of you. You are one body and one Spirit, just as you were in one hope of your calling. One Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, Who is above all beings, pervades all things, and lives in all of us.



### **A Prayer of St. Basil the Great**

O Master Christ our God, King of the Ages, Creator of all things: I thank Thee for all the good things Thou hast given me, especially for the Communion with Thy Most Pure and Life-Creating Mysteries! I pray Thee, O Gracious Lover of Man: preserve me under Thy protection, beneath the shadow of Thy wings! Enable me, even to my last breath, to partake worthily and with a pure conscience of Thy Holy Things, for the remission of sins and unto life eternal! For Thou art the Bread of Life, the Fountain of Holiness, the Giver of all Good; to Thee we ascribe glory, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Arming Ourselves for Spiritual Combat: Fasting and Almsgiving**

The journey of spiritual combat begins with arming ourselves with the powerful disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These practices have been observed by Christians since ancient times, serving as transformative tools in our spiritual growth. Prayer and fasting is a way of imitating Christ's forty-day fast in the wilderness, where He faced the devil's temptations and emerged victorious. By partaking in prayer and fasting, we not only follow Christ's example but also attain a deeper purity of heart. Prayer and fasting involves restraining not only our bodies through abstinence from food and drink but also our souls through the suppression of passions and desires and remaining in communion with God.

Almsgiving embodies the essence of love for our neighbor, reflecting the very nature of God's mercy. The act of giving selflessly to those in need shows our humility and reminds us of God's grace in our lives. Saint John Chrysostom profoundly encourages us to extend our fasting beyond food and drinks, prompting us to fast from slander, gossip, and any form of harm toward others. By embracing prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we equip ourselves with the strength to overcome the spiritual battles that come our way.

## **Overcoming Evil Thoughts: The Battle of the Mind**

One of the most significant challenges in spiritual combat is dealing with evil thoughts that constantly influence our minds. These thoughts can be either good or evil, impacting our spiritual lives in diverse ways. The account of Adam and Eve's fall in the book of Genesis serves as a poignant reminder of the power of temptation. The devil deceived our ancestors by suggesting that they could become like God if they rejected His commandment. This temptation resulted in personal responsibility for sin. Likewise, in our lives, we face continuous temptations to sin, but it is our response that defines the outcome.

The stages of dealing with evil thoughts are a progression: suggestion, internal conversation, struggle, assent, and passion. It begins with a suggestion, which can manifest through images, fantasies, or recollections, and if not dismissed, the evil thought proceeds to penetrate our hearts. The internal conversation with the thought presents us with a choice – to succumb or resist. The struggle to dismiss the thought requires effort, relying on the Word of God and prayer and fasting to achieve victory. If we give assent to the evil thought, accepting and intending to act on it, we have already sinned, even if the action is not realized. This sequence culminates in the state of passion, where a person becomes enslaved by their sinful desires if we do not constantly pray and fast.
