A reading of the Epistle from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians 1:11-19:



Brethren, I want you to know that the gospel I preached is not of human origin. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my previous way of life in Judaism, how intensely I persecuted the church of God and tried to destroy it. I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people and was extremely zealous for the traditions of my fathers. But when God, who set me apart from my mother's womb and called me by his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son in me so that I might preach him among the Gentiles, my immediate response was not to consult any man. I did not go up to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before I was, but I went into Arabia. Later I returned to Damascus. Then after three years, I went up to Jerusalem to get acquainted with Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days. I saw none of the other apostles—only James, the Lord's brother.

Gospel of Matthew 2:13-23



When the Magi had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph, saying, “Arise, and take the child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and remain there until I tell you. For Herod will seek the child to destroy him.” So he arose, and took the child and his mother by night, and withdrew into Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod; that what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet might be fulfilled, “Out of Egypt I called my son.” Then Herod, seeing that he had been tricked by the Magi, was exceedingly angry; and he sent and slew all the boys in Bethlehem and all its neighborhood who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had carefully ascertained from the Magi. Then was fulfilled what was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet, “A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children, and she would not be comforted, because they are no more.” But when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, “Arise, and take the child and his mother, and go into the land of Israel, for those who sought the child’s life are dead.” So he arose and took the child and his mother, and went into the land of Israel. But hearing that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there; and being warned in a dream he withdrew into the region of Galilee. And he went and settled in a town called Nazareth, that there might be fulfillment what was spoken through the prophets, “He shall be called a Nazarene.”

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father, I have heard Jesus Christ called "the New Adam." Can you explain more about this?

The church from its beginning has called Christ the New Adam. The first-created Adam was unable to fulfil the vocation laid before him: to attain deification and bring to God the visible world by means of spiritual and moral perfection. Having broken the commandment and having fallen away from the sweetness of Paradise, he had the way to deification closed to him. Yet everything that the first man left undone was accomplished for him by God Incarnate, the Word-become-flesh, the Lord Jesus Christ. He trod that path of man which the latter was meant to tread towards Him. And if this would have been the way of ascent for man, for God it was the way of humble condescension, of self-emptying (kenosis). St Paul calls Christ the 'second Adam', contrasting Him with the 'first': 'The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven' (1 Cor.15:47). This typology (parallelism) was further explained by St John Chrysostom, who emphasized that Adam was the prototype of Christ: 'Adam is the image of Christ ...as the man for those who came from him, even though they did not eat of the tree, became the cause of death, then Christ for those who were born of Him, although they have done no good, became the bearer of righteousness, which he gave to all of us through the cross'. Few people accepted the second Adam or believed in Him when He came down to earth. The Incarnate Jesus, Who suffered and was raised, became a 'a stumbling block to Jews and folly [Greek, skandalon] to Gentiles' (1 Cor.1:23). Declaring Himself to be God and making Himself equal to God, Jesus is a scandal to Jews and was accused in blasphemy. As to the Greeks, Christianity was folly for them because Greek thought sought a logical and rational explanation for everything; it was not within its power to know a suffering and dying God. For many

centuries Greek wisdom built a temple to 'an unknown God' (Acts 17:23). It was incapable of understanding how an unknowable, incomprehensible, all-powerful, almighty, omniscient and omnipresent God could become a mortal, suffering, weak man. A God, Who would be born of a Virgin, a God Who would be in swaddling clothes, Who would be put to sleep and be fed with milk: all of this seemed absurd to the Greeks. Even among the Christians of the first centuries, the mystery of Godmanhood was explained in a different way. In the second century the Docetists claimed that Christ's human nature was merely transparent: it only seemed that He suffered and died on the cross, while God in fact, being passionless, could not suffer at all. The Docetists considered all that was material and corporeal to be evil and could not concede that God had put on sinful and evil flesh, that He had united Himself with dust. The other extreme was that of Arianism which denied Christ's Divinity and reduced the Son of God to the level of created being. How were extremes to be avoided and how was the Church to find a legitimate explanation for the mystery of Christ? By understanding Jesus is the New Adam, come to conquer sin.

SUNDAY BEFORE CHRISTMAS

"We will hope in Him (the Son of God), and through Him be saved."

The Gospel for this Sunday before Christmas is the genealogy or family tree of Our Lord, God and Savior, Jesus Christ. Today's Gospel is from St. Matthew. The Evangelist Matthew begins his gospel with a listing of the ancestors starting with Abraham. It does not start with the first man Adam, but rather with Abraham who had made a "covenant" with Yahweh God. Genealogy ends with Joseph. This listing of ancestors or forefathers serves as a kind of certificate, which reveals for us who Jesus the new-born infant is. Jesus is the Son of God Who is born "from the House of David. He is fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Jesus is perfect God and perfect man. The Evangelist St. Matthew mentions historical periods, in which the person or event mentioned is "a sign of God's intervention." Through the life decisions of each person mentioned in the genealogy, family tree. God was preparing us, all humanity for the birth of the long-awaited Messiah Who would one day save us, deliver us from sin. Christ is born and we are to glorify Him, In a world, in which there are nations at war. The newborn King, the Prince of Peace, comes to dwell in our midst. During the singing of the "God is with us" Hymn during the Great Compline on Christmas Eve, we reaffirm our belief in the omnipotence of God and His victorious power over evil. God, the Blessed Trinity is Almighty. He will rescue us from those who oppress us. Christ the Lord will crush, destroy the evil desires of those seeking to oppress us. The evildoers, oppressors are told: "For if you rise up again, again will you be crushed, for God is with us." So too their resolutions will not stand. Another versicle of the "God is with us" hymn reaffirms our hope in the Almighty Lord God: "We will hope in Him (the Son of God), and through Him be saved." May the three theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity work together and guide us on our journey to the Heavenly Kingdom. - Father **D. George Worschak**
