October 7, 2018

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

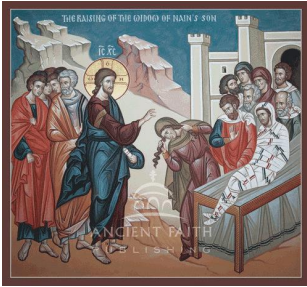

A reading of the Epistle from the holy apostle Paul to the Galatians. 1:11-19:

Brethren, For I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ. You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days; but I did not see any other apostle except James the Lord's brother.

ALLELUIA: (3). In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever. Alleluia(3). verse: Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me. Alleluia(3).



Gospel of Luke 7:11-16

At that time Jesus entered a town called Naim, and his disciples and a large crowd went along with him. As he approached the town gate, a dead person was being carried out—the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the town was with her. When the Lord saw her, his heart went out to her and he said, “Don’t cry.”

Then he went up and touched the bier they were carrying him on, and the bearers stood still. He said, “Young man, I say to you, get up!” The dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother. They were all filled with awe and praised God. “A great prophet has appeared among us,” they said. “God has come to help his people.”

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? What would we do on Sunday if a priest is unavailable for Liturgy? The service you would do is called “Typika.” It’s a brief service for occasions that can be conducted when there is no priest or bishop present. It includes elements of the Divine Liturgy that can be led by a layman. The Holy Doors stay closed on the iconostas- the prayers are said from the nave. There is no communion- because none has been consecrated and there is no minister for distributing communion since no

priest is present.
