October 6, 2019



TROPARION OF THE RESURRECTION: You came down from on high, O Merciful One, and accepted three days of burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our life and our resurrection, glory be to You.

TROPARION OF SAINT THOMAS: O disciple of Christ and member of the apostolic council, your lack of faith proclaimed Christ's resurrection, and your touch confirmed His holy passion. O Thomas, worthy of all praise, pray even now that He grant us peace and great mercy.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,

KONDAK OF SAINT THOMAS: Filled with the grace of wisdom, Your apostle and genuine servant, O Christ, cried out to You in his change of heart: You are my God and Lord. **Now and forever and ever. Amen.**

KONDAK OF RESURRECTION: When You rose from the tomb, You also raised the dead and resurrected Adam. Eve exults in Your resurrection, and the ends of the world celebrate Your rising from the dead, O most merciful One.

PROKEIMENON: Pray and give thanks to the Lord our God. *verse:* In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel. Their utterance has gone forth into all the earth, and their word unto the ends of the world.



A reading from the second Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (6:16-7.1): Brethren, what agreement is there between the temple of God and idols? For we are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people." Therefore, "Come out from them and be separate, says the Lord. Touch no unclean thing, and I will receive you." And, "I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty." Therefore, since we have these promises, dear friends, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out of reverence for God.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia (3). Come, let us rejoice in the Lord; let us acclaim God our Saviour. Alleluia (3). verse: Let us come before His countenance with praise and acclaim Him with psalms. Alleluia (3).

Gospel of Luke 7:11-16



At that time, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd went along with him. As he approached the town gate, a dead person was being carried out—the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the town was with her. When the Lord saw her, his heart went out to her and he said, “Don’t cry.” Then he went up and touched the bier they were carrying him on, and the bearers stood still. He said, “Young man, I say to you, get up!” The dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother. They were all filled with awe and praised God. “A great prophet has appeared among us,” they said. “God has come to help his people.”

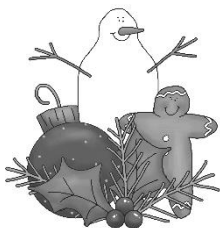


ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father, I went to the website: [Royal Doors.net](http://RoyalDoors.net) and viewed the liturgical texts for this Sunday, I noticed that we are praying for the Holy Apostle Thomas this Sunday. **Why is this not the Sunday of Thomas?** If you look at your Parish calendar and you turn the page over to the back side of October, you will notice that every day we remember a Saint or a Martyr of the church. Saint Thomas the Apostle in our church has a feast day set on October 6. If our parish was named Saint Thomas, then this would be an important day for us and we would have a celebration like we do when we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. These dates on the calendar are called the Martyrology of the Church. Saint Thomas is remembered on October 6th every year, regardless of what day of the week it falls on. This Sunday happens to be October 6th, so we remember Saint Thomas during the Liturgy this Sunday, next this will be on a Tuesday.

By comparison, you will notice on occasional Sundays throughout the year there is a particular feast by name on Sunday, like next Sunday, October 13th is Sunday of the Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council. This feast does not move through the days of the week but rather the Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council feast day is October 11th or the first Sunday following, so that they are always be remembered on a **SUNDAY**. Therefore the **Sunday of Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council** is the Sunday of The Fathers while October 6th is St. Thomas, a movable feast, and therefore **NOT THE SUNDAY OF THOMAS** because this day is not dedicated to a particular Sunday but the date of October 6th.

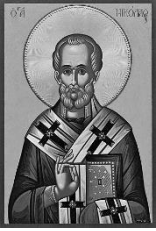
