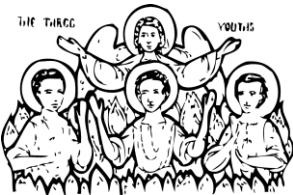

A reading from the First Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to Timothy 1:15-17:

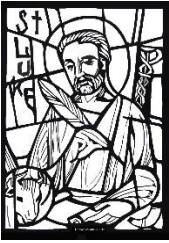

Father I have a question, I was reading an article on The Nativity and the perspective of the Theotokos at the Birth of her Son? Is it true, did Mary really know that the Son she was about to give birth to, was to be the Light of the World and also suffer a horrific death as a “Man?” In short, yes. Remember that just because you don't find something in the Bible does not mean it didn't happen. Remember the Holy Scriptures, the Bible, out of the Catholic Tradition which is oral- there is so much more that is known than has been written. The Church Tradition about Gabriel announcing to Mary is that Gabriel revealed to Mary, who was approximately 14 years old, everything at the Annunciation about Jesus & His life on earth and what He would go through as a Man & God. Mary knew that He was the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. When Mary asked Jesus to do something at the wedding of Cana, she knew that she was asking Christ to start His walk to the Cross. All of this is found in the prayers of the vespers for the Feast day of Annunciation of Theotokos:

“Gabriel stood in your presence, O holy Virgin, and revealed the eternal plan to you. He greeted you and announced: Rejoice, O earth that has not been sown! Rejoice, O burning bush that was not consumed! Rejoice, O unsearchable depth! Rejoice, O bridge which leads to heaven; O high ladder which Jacob saw! Rejoice, O vessel of divine manna! Rejoice, O invocation of Adam! The Lord is with you.”



Father I have a question, how long should I fast before the beginning of the Divine Liturgy in order to receive communion? Let me begin by asking you a question, “How strong do you desire to be spiritually?” Do you desire to be weak when the devil and demons attack or do you desire to strong enough to resist on that evil day as St. Paul tells us? If you desire to be strong you will exercise, just like an athlete exercise- by lifting heavier & heavier weights as you become stronger? So, God gives us three methods of exercising to grow in strength spiritually in the battle against Lucifer and demons-these exercises are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. So, if you desire to be strong and you are fasting before the Sunday morning Divine Liturgy you would have nothing to eat or drink after dinner time Saturday evening. If you desire to be weak, you will do nothing-simply eat breakfast before church Sunday morning. In decades past, you have heard from Bishops that a minimum of three hours before the Liturgy is sufficient, and then a short time after you may have heard that one hour is sufficient. The Bishops reduced it to this, claiming that fasting for the whole night was too difficult and they had to make it easier for people.

Even God is merciful and desires good things for you, he does not ask you to hurt yourself, He is instructing you how to live well. If you are aged and need to eat or drink a small breakfast in order to take medicine, insulin, etc. out of necessity, then it is okay to do so. Now that you are reminded that fasting is a way to grow in self- control and grow in virtue, you can choose for yourself, based on what you are able to do. Just as a young athlete cannot lift the heaviest weights on the first day, neither can a person who has tried to fast in the past or exercise this practice, they will have difficulty fasting from the evening before, but if they begin to practice this, they would be able to accomplish it. So I close with my opening question, how strong do you desire to be?



Psalm 1

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers. Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away. Therefore, the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.
