## TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

August 14, 2022

**TROPAR:** Though the stone was sealed by the Judeans, and soldiers guarded Your most pure body, You arose, O Savior, on the third day, and gave life to the world. And so, the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of Life: Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Your kingdom! Glory to Your saving plan, O only Lover of mankind.

**TROPAR:** O peoples, dance with joy and clap your hands with fervor. Gather today in eagerness and jubilation and sing with glee; for the Mother of God is about to rise in glory, going up from the earth into heaven. It is to her we always sing hymns of praise, for she is the Mother of God.

**TROPAR:** Raised in virtue, O Father Theodosius, from childhood you loved the monastic life and attained your desire courageously. You lived in a cave adorning your life with fasting and radiance and abided in prayer like the bodiless powers. You shone like a beacon in the land of Rus'. Entreat Christ God to save our souls.

**Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Now and forever and ever. Amen.**

**KONDAK:** Today the whole universe dances with joy at your glorious memory, O Mother of God, and it cries out to you: Rejoice, O virgin, pride of Christians.

**PROKIMEN:** Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You. Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His venerable ones.

***A Reading from the First Epistle from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (4:9-16):***

Brethren, for it seems to me that God has put us apostles on display at the end of the procession, like those condemned to die in the arena. We have been made a spectacle to the whole universe, to angels as well as to men. We are fools for Christ, but you are so wise in Christ! We are weak, but you are strong! You are honored, we are dishonored! To this very hour we go hungry and thirsty, we are in rags, we are brutally treated, we are homeless. We work hard with our own hands. When we are cursed, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure it; when we are slandered, we answer kindly. We have become the scum of the earth, the garbage of the world—right up to this moment. I am writing this not to shame you but to warn you as my dear children. Even if you had ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel. Therefore, I urge you to imitate me.

**ALLELUIA:** Alleluia (3) God gives me vindication and has subdued people under me. Alleluia (3). Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to His posterity forever. Alleluia (3). Your priests shall clothe themselves with justice, and Your venerable ones shall rejoice. Alleluia (3).

**Gospel of Matthew 17:14-23:**



At that time, a certain man approached Jesus and knelt before him. “Lord, have mercy on my son,” he said. “He has seizures and is suffering greatly. He often falls into the fire or into the water. I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him.” “You unbelieving and perverse generation,” Jesus replied, “How long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy here to me.” Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of the boy, and he was healed at that moment. Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, “Why couldn’t we drive it out?” He replied, “Because you have so little faith. Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, ‘Move from here to there,’ and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.” When they came together in Galilee, he said to them, “The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill him, and on the third day he will be raised to life.” And the disciples were filled with grief.

**ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Are you Blessing Flowers on Sunday after the Regular Divine Liturgy? How does this work with a Feast on Monday for the Dormition of the Holy Mother of God? If I come to Liturgy at 6:00PM and go to Liturgy at 10:30AM on can I receive communion twice?**

When you go to church Saturday evening at 6:00PM, what is that Liturgy for? Your answer should be the evening Vigil Liturgy that is for Sunday. Do not forget in the church the day begins at sundown. Now take that idea, that template, and apply it to this Sunday, August 14 which is the Pre-Feast of the Dormition of the Mother of God. The regular Sunday Liturgy at 10:30 AM is not the Feast of Dormition of the Mother of God and there is no Blessing of Flowers. The 6:00 PM Liturgy is for the Feast of the Dormition on Monday and is made available for those Parishioners who cannot attend a Monday morning Liturgy. The answer is Yes, if you go to church at 10:30AM on Sunday YOU can receive communion at 6:00PM for the Feast of the Dormition. What is not permissible is to go to church on Saturday at 6:00PM and receive communion AND then go to church on Sunday at 10:30AM and receive communion. You are permitted to go to both Liturgies and pray, but you can only receive communion once for the "Sunday Liturgy."
