ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father I notice that the calendar indicates the Maternity of Anna on December 8, but we repeatedly celebrate it on December 9? Are you using a different calendar?

There are three people who are most important in the Catholic Church: Jesus, (who is both Man & God), John the Baptist (whom Jesus' call greatest born of woman), and Mary (God Bearer). On the Ukrainian Catholic Church Calendar, John is born on June 24. He is conceived September 23. (9 Months + 1 Day) On the UCC Calendar Mary is born September 8. Mary is conceived December 9. (9 months – 1 day) On the UCC Calendar, Jesus is conceived March 25. On December 25, a perfect 9 months later Jesus is born. Our UCC Calendar put Mary on one side of Jesus and John on the other. They both point between themselves saying, "Follow Jesus, He is God." Many of the iconostasis's of our Parishes, for example you see this at Sts. Peter & Paul in Plymouth, you will see the top icon with Jesus on His judgement seat, Mary on His right and John on His left also directing us to Jesus in the middle for He is God. So just as the icons direct us to follow Christ placed in the middle our liturgy and the UCC Calendar do the same thing. The Roman Catholic Calendar used to celebrate all these feast days as described above, but they changed the conception of Mary and John to be a perfect 9 months just like Jesus, losing the message that Christ is God and Follow Him. The Church Calendars that you take home each year are printed by the Ruthenian Church, who here America, because Roman Catholics are so numerous, moved the Conception of Anna to December 8. (It's next week.)

ASK FATHER A QUESTION? Father, I notice that you don't use incense at the weekday Liturgies, can you explain why? Are incense and charcoal two different things? Charcoal and incense are not the same thing. The charcoal

is the heat source that the incense is placed on so that it will vaporized and the aroma will fill the church. As the psalmist says "Let my prayer rise, like incense before you." This leads us to the first question. What is the purpose of the incense? When we remember that rebellion against God and isn is the opposite of obedience to God and virtue, and Lucifer rebelled against God, we can then equate and understand that the pleasing aroma of the incense is like virtue unto God. We then grasp the opposite must be truth, then stench and stink is what Lucifer and the devils in Hell enjoy. As we are men living in this world and able to be tempted by Lucifer and his devils they don't like the pleasing aroma of the incense and the aroma helps to cleanse us of our sins. The church calls incense a sacramental. A sacramental is an aid to men to follow God. The use of incense in the church can never be outlawed or forbidden and can be used in every Liturgy both Sunday and weekday, hence it is permissible on weekday Liturgies to not use incense. Every Sunday and every major Holy Day in our Eastern Church we are supposed to use incense, just as we are supposed to sing these Liturgies if feasible. Because incense is a sacramental and helps us attain heaven,, are weekday Liturgies when the intention is for someone or something that the devil has a strong hold on and more help is needed, I will use incense on those days. This is why you see some weekdays incense is used and sometimes it is not.
